

PUPIL PREMIUM (PP) FUNDING: ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-2021

Funding for PP students is provisional at £16,240

The number of BPRU students eligible for this (FOEVER6) is difficult to calculate and so potentially all students will over time access BPRU’s PP programme.

This is the PP tracking offer that is used to monitor academic, social and emotional progress of our students.

Due to the fluctuation in the number of pupils over the academic year and pupils joining our school at different ages, with different needs and barriers to learning our overall objectives can sometimes be similar to the previous year.

All students had enrichment activities that enabled them to learn more about themselves and are better equipped to self regulate.</p>

£7,000 -staffing for 1:1 English and Maths; tutorials;

£1000 – IAG staffing and 1:1 careers planning, application & interview techniques.

£6190 - Alternative Provision – Paget Farm; Mac Motors; Bike Maintenance; Physical problem solving & team building;

£2050 School Counsellor; MeeToo App; Well Being activities - outside the classroom; Home visits to support the child.

BPRU will need to pay the travel costs for the above off-site events (£900 circa)
