

PUPIL PREMIUM (PP) FUNDING: ACADEMIC YEAR 2022-2023

Funding for PP students is provisional at £8,870 (down by £7,370 from previous year)

The number of BPRU students eligible for this (FOEVER6) is difficult to calculate and so potentially all students will over time access BPRU’s PP programme.

This is the PP tracking offer that is used to monitor academic, social and emotional progress of our students.

Due to the fluctuation in the number of pupils over the academic year and pupils joining our school at different ages, with different needs and barriers to learning our overall objectives can sometimes be similar to the previous year.
