

PUPIL PREMIUM (PP) FUNDING: ACADEMIC YEAR 2023-2024

Funding for PP students is provisional at £8280

The number of BPRU students eligible for this (FOEVER6) is difficult to calculate and so potentially all students will over time access BPRU’s PP programme.

This is the PP tracking offer that is used to monitor academic, social and emotional progress of our students.

Due to the fluctuation in the number of pupils over the academic year and pupils joining our school at different ages, with different needs and barriers to learning our overall objectives can sometimes be similar to the previous year.

KEY OBJECTIVES 2023-2024:

OBJECTIVES	IMPACT
<p>For all students to remain in education; with all Yr 11 students gaining at least two GCSE or equivalent in English & Maths.</p> <p>100% to be entered for 5+ qualifications.</p>	
<p>For 100% Yr 11 students to have 1:1 IAG; attend careers fairs and College taster days – if/when appropriate.</p> <p>0% NEETS in Sept 2024</p>	
<p>Enable students to widen their experiences, improve their resilience, improve self-esteem, improve their MHWB through different activities and build skills such as team work through Learning Outside the Classroom. So becoming more resilient as young adults.</p>	
<p>For each student to access an Individual Learning Programme that is supporting their aspirations or return to mainstream education by attending suitable alternative provision: music; media; etc</p>	

£5,000 -staffing for 1:1 English and Maths; tutorials;

£1210 – IAG staffing and 1:1 careers planning, application & interview techniques; careers fairs; apprenticeship events etc & WEX placements for KS 4 students

£2070 - Alternative Provision & enrichment activities

BPRU will need to pay the travel costs for the above off-site events (£600 circa)
